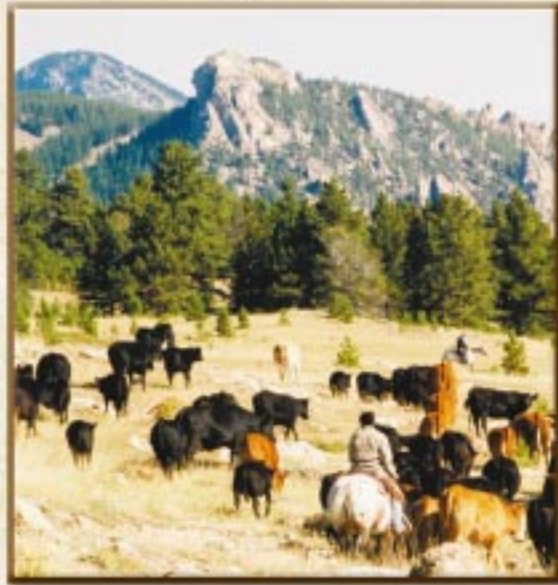


KLONDIKE RANCH PROVIDES AN OUTDOOR ADVENTURE FOR ALL AGES 14 YEARS AND OLDER!

This is more than a dude ranch visit! We invite you to join us in the activities of our working cattle ranch...riding and working cattle under brilliant Wyoming skies then sitting down to a hearty homestyle meal! Breathe our clean fresh mountain air as you wander along a clear rushing trout stream not even caring whether you fish or not! Watch real cowboys compete in local rodeos; join tours which combine area history with awesome and unforgettable scenery.



Soak away any hard-earned sore muscles after a long days ride, chat with friends or simply relax to the sounds of nature.



RANCH ACTIVITIES

Upon arrival, the guests are shown their quarters and introduced to their horse which is reserved for their use during their stay. Horses and saddles are selected with care to insure that riding will be pleasurable even for beginning riders! The experienced rider will be delighted with the opportunities at Klondike... evening rides across the moonlit mesas, windswept open range riding, pack trips over the Big Horns on remote trails which, until the turn of the century, were unknown to the white man. Here waters are teeming with fish and even novice fishermen pull in rainbow and speckled trout! There is also a private reservoir on the ranch for more fishing. Other activities include jeep rides, picnics, barbeques and campfires so conducive to comraderie!

ACCOMMODATIONS

We aim to provide as much quiet and privacy as each individual guest may require. The cabins are widely spaced each with its own private bath.



Three wholesome tasty meals are served daily at convenient hours. All meals are served at the main ranch house with your host family members.



Guests are invited to participate in the operation of the ranch...cattle drives, assisting in the care of the cattle, fixing fences and routine ranch work.



WHAT TO WEAR

Come prepared for outdoor living! Not much time is spent indoors. Having the right clothes will make a big difference in your outdoor comfort. Bring a broad-brimmed hat, riding boots without laces, windbreaker jacket, shirts of flannel or other durable material and a slicker or waterproof jacket which can be rolled up and tied behind the saddle on long rides or pack trips. For hot afternoons, bring your swim suit and shorts for hot tubbing and sun bathing!

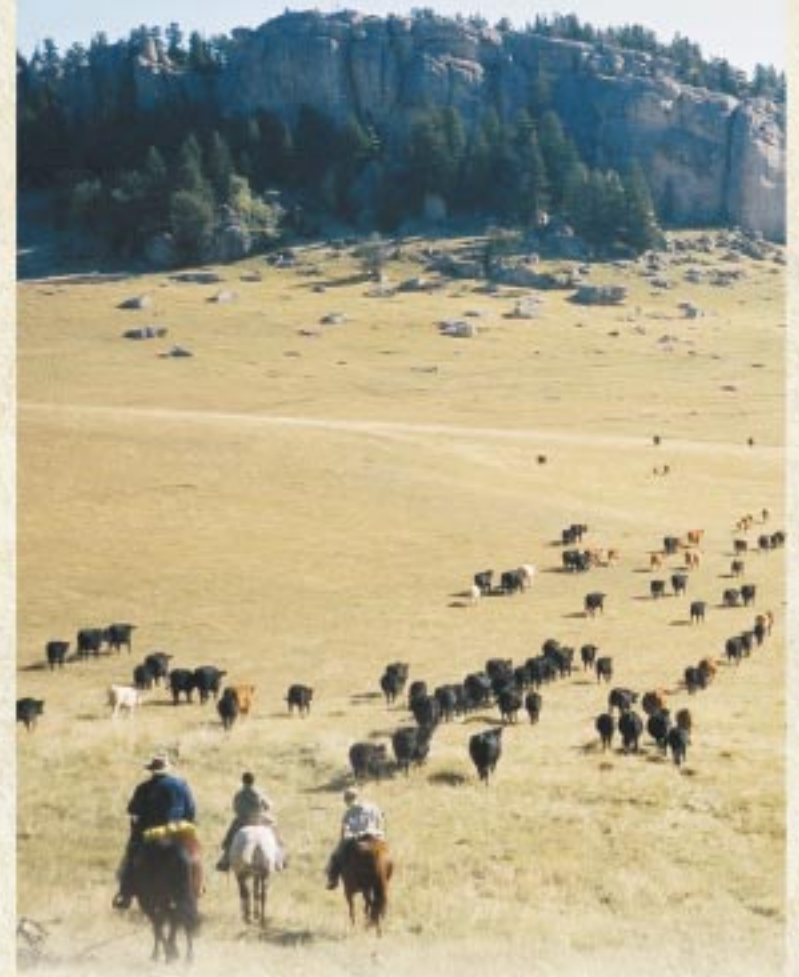

Established in 1886, the Klondike Ranch is located in the rolling country on the eastern side of the Big Horn Mountains of Northern Wyoming. In the early days of the West, pioneers discovered the cool cottonwood-shaded Crazy Woman Creek. They followed the creek to where it rushes from a deep canyon on the face of the Big Horns. They 'found it good' and settled there. Years later the ranch passed to a survivor of the famous Klondike Gold Rush who named it "Klondike". This country, of unparalleled natural beauty, is where Western Tradition was born! The Tass family has owned and operated Klondike as a cattle and guest ranch since 1920.
